



**Work permit for third country nationals,
holder of a residence permit as a « family member »
wishing to engage in part-time salaried activity**

The third-country national, holder of a residence permit as a « family member » wishing to engage in a part-time salaried activity¹, must dispose of a work permit **before starting to work**.

1. Remark

The employer must declare the post vacancy at the Luxembourg Employment Agency (*“Agence pour le Développement de l'Emploi” - ADEM*) before considering the recruitment of a third-country national. The employer signs a work contract with the worker he plans to employ. The starting date on the contract may mention "as soon as the work permit is obtained". The labour market test will not be conducted, it is sufficient for the employer to be able to prove the post vacancy declaration. The employer gives this proof of the post vacancy declaration to the worker who must enclose it in the application for a work permit.

2. Application for a work permit

The applicant must submit an application to the minister in charge of immigration.² The applicant must disclose his/her identity (names, first names) as well as his/her exact address in the country of residence. He/she must also enclose the following documents in the application:

- a copy of his/her valid passport, in its entirety (all pages);
- a *curriculum vitae* ;
- a copy of his/her diplomas or professional qualifications;
- a copy of the work contract, dated and signed by himself/herself and the employer and conforming to Luxembourg labour law;
- proof of the post vacancy declaration at the *“Agence pour le Développement de l'Emploi”*;
- proof of the money transfer/deposit of the issuing tax of EUR 80.- to the following account: CCPL n° LU46 1111 2582 2814 0000 (beneficiary: Ministère des Affaires étrangères et européennes, Direction de l'Immigration; communication: titre de séjour dans le chef de...)
- if need be, a mandate/proxy³.

In case the documents are not in German, French or English, a conforming translation by a sworn translator must be enclosed.

An incomplete application will be sent back to the applicant.

3. Important notice

The authorisation to stay for salaried workers is granted for one profession in one sector for any employer. This restriction remains for the first year. A change of sector or profession is only possible with the approval of the minister in charge of immigration.

¹ If the salaried activity is a full time activity, the holder of a residence permit as a “family member” must dispose of an authorisation to stay as a salaried worker.

² The application can be submitted by sending it to the Immigration Directorate (see address below).

³ The applicant may confer mandate to a third person so as to submit the application in his/her place. In this case, the appointed person, except for juridical consultants, must present a duly signed and dated mandate from the applicant. The signature must be preceded by the handwritten phrase « good for power of attorney ». You can find a model of a mandate/proxy on the internet site www.guichet.lu

As of July 1st 2013, the work permit is no longer issued as separate document. It will be integrated in the residence permit. Should the holder of a valid residence permit as “family member” apply for a work permit, he/she will be granted a new residence permit which includes the information on access to labour market. The residence permit will thus inform on the period of validity of the work permit, and, as long as the access to labour market is restricted, also on the authorised occupation.
